Do legally established ages of consent to sexual activity protect or penalise children?

Brief presentations will address:

- Is the legal age of consent to sexual activity created to protect children against sexual abuse and exploitation, or to restrain children's sexual autonomy?
- Are laws based on dominant moral codes or on informed evidence of child development and child welfare?
- Do laws help or hinder those implementing the law in accounting for young people's different developmental stages, and in balancing rights to protection and sexual autonomy?
